

# <u>20<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time – 20 August 2023</u> <u>Thought for the Week</u>

In our readings this week we hear of welcome, inclusion, joy and God's mercy. Isaiah speaks of the foreigner who respects the laws of the covenant being welcomed in God's temple; 'they will be joyful in God's house of prayer' which 'will be called a house of prayer for all the peoples'. Saint Paul speaks of God showing mercy to all. Jesus in his discussion with the Canaanite woman engages in a robust debate before granting the woman's request; she shows her 'mettle', she is not going to be deterred because she is not of the House of Israel. Her strong will and determination give Jesus the opportunity to show not only God's mercy but also that the hope of salvation which he promised was not limited to the House of Israel.

In recent days, the real-life sign of the spread of God's message and His welcome of all was clearly seen amongst the huge crowds gathered in Lisbon for World Youth Day. Although billed for 'youth', the age spread was from Peruvian babes in prams to pensioners from all nations. All ages, all nations were welcome and present, all were included; peoples from the largest to the smallest of nations, from close neighbours to far distant lands. All heard Pope Francis speak of joy, of joy being 'missionary' and of each person's responsibility to help lift up those have fallen. The joy of so many together was both genuine and infectious - all were truly joyful in the house of prayer which was indeed for all peoples. Each one there was a visible inheritor of the grace and mercy which Christ extended to the Canaanite woman. That inheritance of course is not limited to those gathered in Portugal, it is for all who, however disparate they may be in language, culture, or tradition, share the faith, share the joy and share the responsibility to lift each other up.

With the Summer holidays fast approaching and everyone having busy lives I am concerned that some of you may not have seen the parish emails, or newsletter notice regarding Gift Aid.

Due to the change in the Diocesan charity number, we will not be able to meet HMRC requirements on Gift Aid, worth an extra 25p for every £1 you donate, unless a new form is completed soon.

If you are a taxpayer and give to the church through your bank as a standing order or through the envelopes we need a form completed in order for us to claim the extra Government donation worth approximately £30,000 per annum to the Parish community.
