Thought for the Week

In the First Reading we see Jeremiah's faithfulness to his God-given mission, and what that faithfulness cost him. In the Gospel we see the faithfulness of Jesus, and the kind of faithfulness that is demanded of those who would follow him.

Peter gladly received the revelation of Jesus as the Messiah and Son of God, but he rejected out of hand the revelation of a suffering Messiah. In this he represents the typical Christian, caught between faith and doubt, for whom the cross is a stumbling block

This is a struggle which we all experience in some shape or form. There are things which we don't like doing, but which we know we have to do if we want to be faithful to our responsibilities and obligations. Sacrifice is not an easy road, but it is in this way that our best self takes shape. This is how one becomes a person of character and integrity, and paradoxically this is also the road to happiness. Our happiness does not lie in doing our own thing, or what we feel like doing, but in doing what we have to do.

The only thing that makes sacrifice easy is love. Love enables us to turn the cross from a stumbling block into a steppingstone. What Jesus did was an expression of his love for us and for his Heavenly Father.

The road to Jerusalem brought Jesus to Calvary, but it did not end there. It led to Easter. Jesus supports all those who follow him down the narrow road of sacrifice and shares his Easter victory with them.

World Youth Day July 31 – 7 Aug 2023

"Jesus knows the hearts of each one of you, the successes and the failures, he knows your hearts," "And today he tells you, here in Lisbon for this World Youth Day: 'Don't be afraid".

It is estimated that 1.5 million people attended the final WYD Mass, where Pope Frances's urged the young people not to let their 'great dreams' of changing the world be 'stopped by fear.' Among those listening were some young people of this Parish, who were able to attend through the generosity of parishioners; you had representatives to witness these historic events. Over the coming weeks these events will be shared with you by the young people that attended.

Just over a year ago, we had been advised that the Diocese would be taking a group to WYD, Lisbon 2023. I registered our interest and on a dark Friday evening in last Autumn Elisa, Lilly and I attended an introduction talk in Basingstoke. Then on the solemnity of Christ the King, bookings went live, the deposits were paid, we were on our way to WYD 2023!

From January to July this year, monthly preparations sessions and group calls were attended by our group. This enabled the foundations for friendship and relationships to begin to form.

But nothing could prepare the group for the enormity of what would be encountered once they arrived in Lisbon....

WYD is aimed at young people from 16 to 35, however this attending age group went way above, with people well in their 70's attending to young children and babes in arms.

The atmosphere in the city was magical, all around were groups of people, from all over the world, playing instruments, singing, chanting, dancing, diverse groups of religious orders and clergy, waving flags that represented their diocese and their countries.

People would approach you to talk, ask questions, trade items from their country. New friendships were formed, some will remain lifelong! The most powerful thing was that every which way you looked, every chant that was made and every item swapped, came from another Catholic. This was perhaps the most powerful and enormous message of all, that everyone there was there because they were proud to be Catholic, they wanted to see Papa Francesco, they see and want a future in the church!

There were no awkward conversations about what you were doing there, rather conversations about what your faith means to you, and for you.

Everyone prayed, everyone fell to their knees on the street, in the road, at catechesis in the park, everyone around you was singing, praying, and looking for the umbrella which signified the presence of the Blessed Sacrament on the street or in the park at communion time.

Over the week our group attended the opening and closing ceremonies, they danced on the streets, we witnessed the Pope drive past and wave to us, in Fatima everyone attended Mass where our clergy, bishop and a group member took part.

We listened to Bishop Baron talk and preach. We attended the Change concert with Matt Maher at Benfica Stadium. On Saturday the vigil was held overnight, followed by the closing Mass, in which Bishop Philip took part, and Ruth one of our groups read in front of the Pope.

We travelled with Bishop Philip, Canon PJ, Fr Mark, Fr Godwin, Sr Lucy, Sr Carino, three diocesan seminarians from Rome, Niall Farrell our leader and Jo, the Youth Coordinator from Winchester.

Please continue to pray for off all that attended WYD, may the seeds sown continue to grow in all our young people.
