

# 25<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time-24 September 2023 Thought for the Week

Today's gospel is the parable of the workers in the vineyard when Jesus teaches us about God's generous mercy. The core message is that God's love and mercy is pure gift, freely given and not earned.

On the surface, the parable appears to be unfair, an offence to common sense. Those who work a longer day ought to be paid more. If we consider the landowner unfair, we are reading into the parable our own preconceived notions of how fairness and equality should be quantified. This is not God's way!

A closer read shows us that the landowner paid on the terms that were negotiated and acted completely justly. The landowner is not simply just, but exceptionally just, even radically just. Those who laboured in the field for a full day were given their due pay. Those who worked a single hour were also given a full-day's wage. No one is cheated. A few receive abundantly just as we receive abundantly from God - more than our due. God, like the landowner, is radically just and abundantly generous. As the Psalmist says: "God's greatness cannot be measured. God is kind and full of compassion...abounding in love."

Today is also **World Day of Migrants and Refugees**. History teaches us that the contribution of migrants and refugees has been fundamental to the spiritual, societal, and economic growth of our societies. Catholic communities like ours are enriched by the variety and diversity of people from other cultures and traditions. They can enliven our celebrations, open our minds to new horizons and offer us a privileged opportunity for experiencing more fully the catholicity of the People of God. Let us imitate the radical generosity of God in 'welcoming the stranger,' remembering words of Scripture: "Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for in doing so, some have entertained angels without knowing it."
