

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time - 21 January 2024

Thought for the Week

This is 'Sunday of the Word of God,' to emphasise the importance of the Scriptures for our lives as disciples of Christ.

"The time has come" says Jesus. It is the beginning of his public ministry. John was arrested. He had to step in and take John's place, take up the mission assigned to him. He began in Galilee. His message seemed simple: "Repent and believe the Good News." In Biblical terms the word 'repent' is much more than being sorry, it is a call to rearrange your entire way of life. It is a radical 'turning around' of your life. Sometimes we know when the 'time is right' - to change direction, leave home, take on a new job. It can be exciting and daunting at the same time.

After his dramatic opening call to 'repent' Jesus walks along the shore where he sees fishermen. He issues a personal call to follow him, and 'I will make your fishers of men' (women too!) Was he going to turn these fishermen into evangelists? He was calling them to change their entire way of life, to become his disciples.

He may have observed the lifestyle of these four young professional fishermen. They learned their 'trade' by watching, listening, observing, and doing what their Dads did. Fishermen's work is hard, exposed to cold and wet; often dangerous in choppy waters; bad weather won't keep them from fishing. They may toil for long hours, night and day and catch nothing. But they don't give up.

Jesus was calling these four men to accompany him, learn from him, follow him and he would teach about attracting 'catching' people with his message of Good News, the new way – kingdom of God – was here. It was a radical change of lifestyle.

Discipleship is a lived experience. That same 'call' is for us, to be disciples of the Good News. It's a call never to give up, to learn from Jesus, do the things he did, bear witness to his message so as to proclaim the 'Good News' by our lives.
