Our Parish has embarked on a journey, through the Bishop's Ten Year Plan, to bring us 'Closer to Christ.' As part of our journey we are all invited to contribute to the life of the Parish. Our ambitious Mission Plan will fail, he said, without a deep spiritual renewal in ourselves and in our parish communities.

Have you adopted Six Holy Habits?

- Keeping Sunday special, a family day by attending Mass on Sunday Could I prepare better for Mass, arriving in good time, reading the Gospel and the prayers?
- Spending five minutes a day in prayer what help do I need to pray and to know the Bible better?
- To do penance on Fridays, and to serve the poor and needy what does poverty mean in my area and how can I help?
- Every fortnight make a Holy Half Hour before the Blessed Sacrament how can I hear more clearly the voice of Jesus calling me?
- Going to Confession once a month or so how can I best prepare?
- Joining a small group for formation, prayer and fellowship Many groups would welcome new members or why not start a new one?
