

Fourth Sunday in Lent - 10 March 2024

Thought for the Week

The first reading this weekend shows how God remained faithful to his people in spite of their infidelities. God's promises were not nullified by the sins of his people. It was because of their sins that God allowed his people to be exiled to Babylon. His mercy is seen in their home coming.

The second reading stresses the enormity of the love God has shown us in Christ. It makes it clear that we owe our salvation, not to our own efforts, but to the goodness of God.

We are shown in the Gospel how God's love and mercy are seen in the fact that he sent his Son to save us. Jesus came into the world as a light. Sadly, some preferred darkness to the light, thus sealing their own condemnation. Judgement is not passed by God; people judge themselves by their response to the light.

People condemn themselves by adopting a negative attitude. God sent us light. If people get lost it is because they haven't accepted the light; the fault is not God's but ours.

It's terrible to reject the light, to reject God's offer of love; but how sweet to walk in the light of his love. Our part in the process of redemption is to accept the gift in all humility and try to respond in kind. We are able to love God because God loved us first.

There is darkness in all of us. We need to let the light of Christ shine into that darkness, whatever form it takes, but there is goodness in us too. We are also attracted to the light. We should trust this goodness and try to follow it.

I have witnessed the good and light in our Parish Community as we all have embraced the Time Talents and Treasures Ministries Fairs over the last two weekends. Let us all make the last Ministries Fair this coming Sunday one to remember.
