

Third Sunday of Easter - 14 April 2024 Thought for the Week

In the First Reading Peter shows great courage when he confronts the people with their part in the death of Jesus. However, he goes on to excuse them on the grounds that they acted in ignorance. In this the dying prayer of Jesus may have inspired him. 'Father, forgive them, they know not what they do.' He urges them to repent, assuring them that if they do their sins will be forgiven. In the Gospel Luke's primary interest is to show that the risen Jesus is the same person the apostles had known prior to the crucifixion. He emphasises the reality of Jesus bodily resurrection but makes it clear that the resurrection is not a return to earthly life, Jesus has risen to a new life beyond death.

One theme that occurs in all three readings is forgiveness, which is available to all those who repent and believe in Jesus as their Saviour. This has great relevance for us. A lot of ugly crimes are committed today, not all of which can be put down to ignorance. If there is forgiveness for those who killed Jesus, then surely there is forgiveness for those who do these things. Our task is to assure people that God's forgiveness is available to them, thus enabling them to make a fresh start.

Easter doesn't take away our pain or remove our fears, but it does introduce a new element into our lives. It gives meaning to our pain, and lights it up with hope. All is different because Jesus is alive and speaks his words of peace to us, as he spoke to them to the apostles. When we fail under trial and temptation we can draw encouragement from the story of Jesus own disciples, all of whom failed during The Passion.

Therefore, there is a quiet joy among us and a deep sense of peace because we know that life is stronger than death.
